VA's Zero Tolerance Policy

VA has a zero-tolerance policy for harassment or sexual assault.

Harassment and sexual assault, including sexual harassment and gender-based harassment, is inappropriate conduct and not tolerated. A comment or behavior that makes another feel uncomfortable could be considered harassment.

VA takes all reports of harassment seriously and will investigate and take appropriate action.

Prohibited Behavior

Prohibited behavior includes conduct that is unwelcome or offensive but not limited to:

Harassment is unwelcome conduct that creates an intimidating, hostile or offensive environment.

- » Bullying or intimidating behavior/language
- » Degrading jokes, insults, or slurs
- » Threat of violence or physical assault

Sexual Harassment is unwelcome verbal or physical contact of a sexual nature. This can also include offensive remarks about a person's sex or gender.

- » Catcalls "Hey handsome, come sit by me," "You're too pretty to be a Vet"
- » Whistles, leering, staring
- » Sexual gestures, jokes, or teasing
- » Degrading comments about a person's sex, sexual or gender identity, or transgender status

Sexual Assault is sexual contact or attempted contact that occurs without explicit consent of the experiencer.

- » Unwelcomed hugging, groping, grabbing, pinching, stroking
- » Forced or intrusive touching
- » Intentionally rubbing or brushing up against someone
