- Your purview in the document is construction. I happen to have a little experience with the VA construction process, and the length of time it can take to build a hospital. I want to commend you on your statement

regarding community resources and how the VA can work with them to provide accessible care to veterans in rural, remote, and underserved areas.

I wanted to bring to the Committees' attention your final statement in the construction portion of the Independent Budget. "Last year VA identified nearly 500 buildings totaling 7.5 million square feet of under- or unutilized space that VA must continue to maintain. Unused space is a financial drain on VA overall operations and maintenance budget.

Every effort must be made to repurpose, lease, or dispose of these properties."

 The VFW is an active and valued partner to us in Congress as we work to keep our promise to America's veterans. Making sure that the VA can meet the challenges of the 21st century is a job for us all. I know that VFW, your members across the country, and your staff here in Washington are ready and eager for the challenge.
