A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to establish a pilot program to hire transitioning servicemembers to be Border Patrol agents.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Border Pa-
- 5 trol Training Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. BORDER PATROL SKILLBRIDGE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 7 (a) Establishment.—Not later than 180 days after
- 8 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
- 9 Homeland Security, in collaboration with the Secretary of

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- 1 Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, shall estab-
- 2 lish an interdepartmental pilot program through which the
- 3 Department of Homeland Security shall use the Depart-
- 4 ment of Defense SkillBridge Program to train and hire
- 5 transitioning servicemembers as Border Patrol agents for
- 6 U.S. Customs and Border Protection.
- 7 (b) Employment Skills Training.—In carrying
- 8 out the pilot program established pursuant to subsection
- 9 (a), the Secretary of Homeland Security, in collaboration
- 10 with the Secretary of Defense, shall use the authorities
- 11 available under section 1143 of title 10, United States
- 12 Code, to train and facilitate the transition of members of
- 13 the armed forces to service as Border Patrol agents.

14 SEC. 3. ANNUAL REPORTS.

- Not later than 1 year after the pilot program is estab-
- 16 lished pursuant to section 2(a), and annually thereafter
- 17 until the date referred to in section 4, the Secretary of
- 18 Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of
- 19 Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, shall sub-
- 20 mit a report to the Committee on Homeland Security and
- 21 Governmental Affairs of the Senate, the Committee on
- 22 Armed Services of the Senate, the Committee on Veterans'
- 23 Affairs of the Senate, the Committee on Homeland Secu-

19	SEC. 4. SUNSET DATE.
